Geo Abstracts Ltd. Revives Geophysical Abstracts

Geo Abstracts Ltd., University of East Anglia, Norwich, England, has begun publishing Geophysical abstracts, a bi-monthly abstracting journal covering the field of solid-earth geophysics. The publication carries on the abstracting service offered by the U.S. Geological Survey's Geophysical abstracts from 1929 to 1971. USGS discontinued the journal in 1971, citing duplication of bibliographic service offered in the Bibliography and index of geology. Geo Abstracts plans to publish 2000-3000 abstracts the first year. Coverage of solid earth geophysics will be close to that of the earlier abstract journal. The editor points out "some significant differences between the two publications." The series "will not cover the moon and planets, isotope geology, glaciology, submarine geology and meteorology unless there is some specific relevance to solid earth geophysics. Other aspects of these subjects are already covered by other abstracting publications." Glaciology is already covered in Geo abstracts A (Quaternary); ionospheric topics and planetology are found in Meteorological and geoastrophysical abstracts. There will be no overlap with Mineralogical abstracts. The annual subscription (£15.00 or \$30.00) includes the six bi-monthly issues as well as the separate annual subject and author indexes. EERI Issues Earthquake Planning And Field Guides

Earthquake Engineering Research Institute, Oakland, Calif., has published Learning from earthquakes, 1977 planning and field guides as part of an EERI effort to "maximize" the learning from future destructive earthquakes by planning post-earthquake investigations in advance. The Planning guide is for use by executives of governmental, research, professional, construction, and financial organizations in planning their actions before and after the earthquake. Major sections of the Planning guide include seismic risk to cities, earthquake investigations and summaries of EERI earthquake response procedures." The Field guides are for use by investigators in the engineering, geoscience and social science fields.
