First Circular For ICGI Issues Call For Papers

A call for contributed papers and a show of participant interest are the subjects of a First Circular prepared for the Second International Conference on Geological Information, May 23-27, 1982, in Golden, Colorado, The circular was prepared by GIS International Program Committee member Dick Walker and distributed by Program Committee member Julie Bichteler (Professor, Graduate School of Library Science, University of Texas at Austin, Box 7576, University Station, Austin, TX 78712). Distribution of circulars outside the Americas will be handled by the Geological Information Group of the Geological Society of London. A final circular in December 1981 will include the program and registration forms. Hart Phinney, Chairman of the Local Committee, has appointed Mary Larsgaard (Colorado School of Mines) and Bob Bier (USGS Library, Denver) to handle campus and area arrangements respectively. A special block of dormitory rooms within easy walking distance to the conference center has been reserved for those attending the conference. A modestly-priced room/board package will be offered. Rooms without meals are also available

The conference theme will be international cooperation to identify and share geological information. The program will likely include sessions on current activities in both national surveys and geoscience information groups; international programs and prospects for the future; development of inventories of national resources information (bibliographic data bases and numerical data banks); and a special session for topics such as building library collections, specialized data files, map acquisition, translations, and publishing. Exhibits and local field trips will reflect the conference topics.

Initial interest for the conference has been high. To keep it that way, the organizers will investigate every avenue to create an exciting international experience within reasonable cost. Fossil Vertebrate Bibliography Now Cooperative Venture

The American Geological Institute, the Society of Vertebrate Paleontology, and the Museum of Paleontology, University of California, Berkeley, have announced their cooperative agreement to produce bibliographies of fossil vertebrates. The *Bibliography of fossil vertebrates*, 1978 is their first effort to contribute to the

scholarly work begun in 1928 by C. L. Camp and V. L. Vanderhoof. The last volume of their series was published in 1973. A cumulative bibliography covering 1973-1977 and the 1979 volume are now in preparation. The American Geological Institute will now publish the Bibliography of fossil vertebrates annually. The Bibliography of fossil vertebrates, 1978 was edited by Joseph T. Gregory, Judith A. Bacskai and George V. Shkurkin, Ms. Bacskai and Mr. Shkurkin, along with others at the Museum of Paleontology, provided the systematic indexing. The Bibliography contains nearly 1400 references to books, serials, monographs, and North American theses cited in the GeoRef data base in 1978. The 380-paged publication contains author, subject, and systematic indexes as well as a useful list of serials cited. Its format is attractive, easily readable, and provides quick access to the literature. AGI Initiates New Service, Minerals Exploration Alert

The American Geological Institute has initiated a unique service focused on the specific information needs of geoscientists involved in minerals exploration and mining. Coal and petroleum are excluded as they are covered by other services. Minerals exploration alert is a bi-weekly publication that pinpoints essential information in books, journal articles, maps, theses, reports, and patents. There are twenty subject headings with an alphabetical listing by author within each. Each citation contains complete bibliographic information as well as additional data useful to the searcher. The cost of 26 issues of MEA plus two semiannual cumulative subject and author indexes is \$350 per year.
